

ANNUAL REPORT 1988-89

The same

General

The Council was established by the Government of India in 1972. It has a Chairman and 27 members of whom 18 are historians appointed for three years by the Government of India, and 7 exofficio members; the Secretary, Ministry of Human Resource Development; Secretary, Department of Culture; Financial Adviser of the Ministry of HRD, Government of India; Director, National Archives of India; Director, Archaeological Survey of India; and Chairman of the UGC. The composition of the Council as on 31 March 1989 is given in Appendix-I. The strength of the Council as on 31 March 1989 is given in Appendix-II.

The Indian Council of Historical Research has been pursuing the objective of encouraging a scientific, secular and comprehensive study of history in accordance with its original purposes It has extended grant-in-aid to research projects, theses, monographs and journals, and has awarded fellowships to a number of scholars and given travel-cum-contingent grants for conducting historical research within and outside the country. Financial assistance has also been extended to professional organisations of historians for organising seminars and symposia and holding academic conferences. The Council brings out its own journal The Indian Historical Review, which contains articles, notes, review articles and reviews. As a part of the celebration of the 40th Anniversary of India's Independence Movement and the Birth Centenary of Jawaharlal Nehru the Council brought out an issue devoted to the freedom struggle. As part of the same celebration it also organised a number of 15-day Workshops on the National Movement in different parts of the country for university and college teachers.

Among other publications of the Council have been the Encyclopaedia of Indian Archaeology, in two volumes, and Labour Movement in India documents of which one volume has been published. During the period under review the Council has expanded the Library for the use of historians and researchers and continues to provide documentation services to the scholars.

During 1988-89 the Council continued to place emphasis on the fulfilment of its aims and objects by focusing attention on the less explored areas of historical research which include study of socio-economic formations; history of ideas; history of peasantry; agrarian relations; urban studies and demography pertaining to all periods of Indian History. Different aspects of freedom struggle covering all regions of the country and history of science and technology also received attention.

The work on the special project *Towards Freedom*, 1937-47 continued. Documents collected for Volume II were examined with a view to assessing its feasibility for publication. Eight editors for eight volumes of documents with the General Editor held two meetings and worked out a plan in order to complete the project by 1990. The Advisory Committee constituted for the project met in March 1989 and framed suggestions for the collection and selection of documents.

INCOME

During the year 1988-89 the Council received a total sum of Rs. 129.19 lakhs from the Ministry of Human Resource Development. Government of India. This comprised Rs. 39.90 lakhs for plan, Rs. 74.70 lakhs for non-plan, Rs. 13.59 lakhs for the special project, Towards Freedom and Rs. 1.00 lakh for Indo-French Seminar. As on 1.4.89 the Council had Rs. 45/- as cash in hand and Rs. 17,103/- in the Bank. Thus the total opening balance was Rs. 17,148/-. The Council also realised a sum of Rs. 43,107/- from the sale of books/ journals and royalties. A detailed account for the year 1988-89 and the Annual Audit Report may be seen at Appendices III & IV respectively.

III FUNDING HISTORICAL RESEARCH

The most important objective of the Council has been to extend financial assistance to scholars/institutions for historical research and publications. The grants-in-aid schemes of the Council include funds for (1) Research Projects; (2) Fellowships; (3) Study-cum-travel grants to researchers pursuing M. Phil, Ph. D. and Post-doctoral-work; (4) financial assistance to the publication of historical works; (5) grants-in-aid to various organisations of historians for holding seminars, symposia and academic conferences as well as workshops and (6) implementing cultural exchange programmes under the aegis of the Council. The detailed information about the grants-in-aid provided to scholars/organizations since the inception of the Council till 31 March 1989 given below:

A detailed list of research projects, fellowships and study-cumtravel grants shows a large increase during the year 1988-89. The number of Fellowships, Projects, etc., that can be funded is restricted by limitation of research. In order to utilise our resources best, we have improved our mechanism of assessment. Each proposal received for financial assistance in the Council is carefully examined by experts and then placed before the Research Projects Committee of the Council for consideration. Attention has been paid to ensure that the Council's funds are properly utilised and evenly distributed throughout the country. A detailed list of the projects, fellowships and study-cum-travel grants may be seen in Appendices V, VI & VII.

NATIONAL FELLOWSHIP

The ICHR has instituted National Fellowships to a maximum of six at any time, to assist very eminent historians in undertaking researches on fundamental aspects of Indian History.

In 1988-89 the Council approved of 61 theses/manuscripts for publication subsidy (Appendix-VIII).

D

As part of the celebration of the 40th Year of Independence and Nehru Birth Centenary, it has been planned to publish a

volume "We have Fought together for Freedom". Twelve contributions for the volume were received during the year. These are being edited for publication. A historical monograph on ShankaracharYa and his Thought is being prepared under the aegis of the Council by the eminent historian of religious thought, Dr G. C. Pande.

M

Special Project (Towards Freedom)

During the period under report Professer S. Gopal took over as General Editor of the Project "Towards Freedom, 1937-1947". Eight Editors of projects were given special assistance by assignment of research assistants to collect research material for the volumes. The members of the *Towards Freedom* staff were engaged in collecting material from the National Archives of India, Nehru Memorial Museum and Library and Sapru House Library. Attention is being paid to collect documents from private papers, institutional papers and contemporary newspapers so as to fill the gaps in the materials already collected for the project. The research materials collected by the staff in the National Archives of India were catalogued and handed over to the Editors for their use in the respective volumes.

VII

INTERNATIONAL COLLABORATION AND FOREIGN TRAVEL GRANTS

1. Foreign Travel Grants for collection of source material from abroad and for attending international seminars and conferences:

During the period under report 15 scholars were given foreign travel grants for collecting research material and presenting papers to various international seminars and conferences (Appendix IX).

2. Cultural Exchange Programme:

During the period under report, implementation of proposals under the Cultural Exchange Programme with the following countries was taken up: Afghanistan, Bahrain, Finland, France, German Democratic Republic, Iran, Iraq, Japan, Korea (South), Netherlands, USSR, Yemen (PDRY) and Zimbabwe. The various exchanges actually undertaken are listed below:

- a. Afghanistan: Two Afghan scholars from the Academy of Sciences of Afghanistan visited India for three months. One Indian scholar visited Afghanistan for two weeks.
- b. Bahrain: Publications received from Bahrain.
- c. Finland: Publications sent to Finland. An Indian scholar nominated to visit Finland to participate in a workshop with a view to revising the coverage of India in Finnish school text-books.
- d. France: Joint Saminar on India and the French Revolution held during February 1989 in New Delhi (see Appendix).
- e. GDR: Two scholars from the Academy of Sciences of GDR visited India for six weeks.
- f. Iran: Exchange of Publications proposed.
- g. Iraq: It is proposed to send an Indian scholar to Iraq.
 Applications to be invited from Universities.
- h. Japan: Proposal to invite applications from universities for implimentation of the exchange programme.
- i. Jordan: Publications exchanged.
- j. Korea (South): List of publications sent to Korea.
- k. Netherlands: Two Dutch scholars received. An Indian scholar was sent. It is proposed to nominate two more Indian scholars to visit the Netherlands.
- I. USSR: Proposed to hold a joint seminar on Colonialism and Culture in New Delhi during 1989.
- m. Yemen: The Director visited Yemen to explore areas of cooperation between India and Yemen.
- n. Zimbabwe: List of publications sent to Zimbabwe.

VIII

SEMINARS/WORKSHOPS AND CONFERENCES

The Council gave financial assistance to 74 professional organisations of historians for holding conferences, seminars, etc. both at regional and national levels. These include the Indian History Congress, South Indian History Congress, Orissa History Congress, U.P. History Congress, North-East Indian History Congress, Punjab History Congress, Andhra History Congress, Indian Archaeological Society, Epigraphy Society of India, Numismatic Society of India, etc. Financial assistance was also extended for the publication of 62 historical Journals and proceedings of the various conferences (Appendix X).

WORKSHOPS

As a part of the programme to celebrate the 40th Anniversary of Indian Independence Movement and birth centenary of Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru the Council organised six workshops for university and college teachers with its own funds in different parts of the country. The first workshop in this series was organised at Pondicherry University, Pondicherry, from 15 May to 30 May 1988. Forty participants drawn from the Universities and colleges of Tamil Nadu and Pondicherry participated in it. Thirty-six lectures were delivered in a 15 day workshop by eminent scholars, including Professors Y. Vaikuntham, V. Ramakrishna, S. Bhattacharya and Mushirul Hasan. The reading material in two volumes (documents and articles relating

to various aspects of Indian Nationalism) prepared by the ICHR was released by the Chief Minister. The valedictory function of the workshop was presided over by Professor S. Gopal in which certificates were given to the participants by the Lieutenant Governor. The second Workshop was organised from 1 June to 14 June at the Osmania University, Hyderabad. It evoked great interest in the public and the press. Attended by forty-one scholars drawn from different parts of the State, the freedom fighters of Andhra Pradesh including Professor A.G. Ranga participated in the discussion and narrated their own experiences about the freedom struggle. Thirty talks spread over fifteen days were delivered by noted historians and freedom fighters. Almost all aspects of freedom struggle was covered in the lectures delivered at the Workshop. The key-speakers included Professor K. Mazumdar, Professor V. Ramakrishna, Professor K. Seshadari and Professor V. Vaikuntham. Sixty sets of reading materials in two volumes were distributed among the participants.

The third Workshop took place at Srinagar with Professor A.Q. Rafiqui as Director, at the University of Kashmir, Srinagar, from 2 June to 17 June 1989. Thirty-five participants drawn from Himachal Pradesh, Haryana and Jammu & Kashmir attended. Inaugurated by the Chief Minister on 2 June 1989, the Workshop continued for 15 days in which Professor V.N. Datta, Dr Asghar Ali Engineer, Shri B.R. Nanda, Professor Mushirul Hasan and Professor S. Bhattacharya delivered lectures. The fourth Workshop was organised in Calcutta at the Rabindra Bharati University from 29 November to 14 December 1988. Fifty scholars from West Bengal attended it. Twenty-five talks were delivered by eminent scholars. The key-note address was delivered by Professor Irfan Habib, Chairman, ICHR. The other resource persons included Professor B.B. Chaudhuri, Dr Amalendu De, Professor Mushirul Hasan, Professor Tarasankar Banerjee, Professor Barun De and Professor K. K. Sen Gupta.

The fifth Workshop was organised at the Jamia Millia Islamia, New Delhi, from 26 December 1988 to 6 January 1989. It was inaugurated by Professor Ravinder Kumar. About 35 scholars from Delhi and Haryana participated in the Workshop. The key-speakers

included were Professors S. Bhattacharya, Parthasarathy Gupta, Bipan Chandra, J.S. Grewal, Aparna Basu and Indu Banga.

The sixth and last Workshop of the financial year 1988-89 took place at Bhagalpur from 7 February to 19 February 1989. Forty-five scholars from different parts of Bihar attended it. The resource persons included Professors R.S. Sharma, S.R. Singh, Tarasankar Banerjee and J.C. Jha.

SEMINAR ON NEW ARCHAEOLOGY

The ICHR organised an international seminar on India and New Archaeology in October 1988. Notable archaeologists from India and abroad attended and read key-papers. Professers J.D. Clark (USA), Peter Ucho (UK), Ian Hodder (UK) and H. Polach (Australia) were invited from abroad. Leading archaeologists from Indian universities and officials of the Archaeological Survey of India were also present. The proceedings of the Seminar are now being edited for publication.

IX

THE INDIAN HISTORICAL REVIEW

During the period under report *The Indian Historical Review* Vol. XII, Nos. 1-2 (July 1985 — January 1986) was issued; this was dedicated to the history of Indian Resistance to British Rule and the National Movement, as part of the national celebration of the Fortieth Year of Independence and Jawaharlal Nehru Birth Centenary, and appeared in October 1988. It contained 15 articles, 4 review articles and 35 book reviews.

The manuscript of *The Indian Historical Review* Vol. XIII, Nos. 1-2 (July 1986 — January 1987) comprising 9 articles, 3 review articles, 73 reviews of books, 3 short notices, 1 note and 2 tributes was edited and submitted for publication in March 1989. The volume has since been released. It also contains a note on Dictionary of Social, Economic and Administrative terms in Indian Inscriptions which the Council plans to bring out during the period of the Eighth Plan.

DOCUMENTATION CUM LIBRARY CENTRE

Acquisition

The Centre's holdings consist of published source materials, secondary works and learned journals/periodicals on the various periods and aspects of Indian and non-Indian history. The Centre also has a collection of works in microfilm/microfische.

- c) We have also taken up compilation of reviews of books on Indian History and a retrieval list would be compiled and circulated.

Recently the centre has acquired a Reader-cum-Printer to enable the users to make the best use of the microfilm/microfische holdings of the centre, or to transfer microfilms of sources in their possession into plain-paper copies.
